Our students were given detailed guidance by the admission teams from some of the top universities across the country.

We have opened our doors to many parents and the community with events such as Open Evening, Parents Evenings, Parents Literacy and Numeracy Classes, and our Winter Festival. We have also held our annual Presentation Evening for our Year 11 students who graduated last academic year. It was great seeing our past students excelling academically and adjusting to the rigours of the working environment.

Finally, we have had a great start to our fund raising events. We have had three main events so far-Macmillan Coffee Morning, Children in Need and World Aids Awareness Day. Overall, we have raised approximately £1500.

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

# **CORE VALUES**

## **COLLABORATION** ECHO ETERNAL PROJECT

Rockwood Academy has had the privilege to be selected to be involved in a special Government initiative which has helped raise awareness and promote the significance of the holocaust. Echo Eternal is a commemorative arts, media and civic engagement project delivered in schools for children of all ages, inspired by the testimony of British survivors of the Holocaust. The testimony was captured by the UK Holocaust Memorial Foundation - UKHMF. The project is underpinned by CORE Education Trust's track record in bringing together diverse communities in a collaborative context, in this case with a common focus of Holocaust memorial and genocide awareness. This focus is supported by the creation of collaborative civic alliances between schools with different social and cultural characteristics.

Over the past year, Rockwood students have been working with Sima Gonsai, a local director, to put together a reflective artistic 'echo' to best remember the holocaust victims. By using the testimony of Mady Gerrard, students were able to interpret her story into a video remembering the journey she went through. The shooting of the video took place in November 2018 and will be released shortly. We have also been hosting the rehearsals for the 'echo' here at Rockwood Academy, with lots of students coming together from other schools to perfect their performance.

The project is so successful that the Prime Minister has even praised it: "I see it in innovative new projects like Echo Eternal in Birmingham where schools from every background are working with the CORE Education Trust and the Centre for Holocaust Education at University College London to create their own responses to the testimonies of survivors.

She went on to commend the media element of the project which she said "inspired children to make their own films to promote tolerance, empathy and hope."

## **OPPORTUNITY** YEAR 10 STUDENTS GO TO THE SKILLS SHOW!

The UK's largest skills, apprenticeships and careers event was held on 15-17 November at the NEC Birmingham. We decided that this would be a fantastic opportunity for Year 10 to explore the vast array of career opportunities that are open to them. The event was divided into 4 areas: - Construction & Infrastructure; Health, Hospitality & Lifestyle; Digital, Business & Creative; Engineering & Technology. There were lots of high-profile organisations who were exhibiting at the show, including car manufacturers such as Ford, Volkswagen and Jaguar-Land Rover, technology companies such as Huawei and Toshiba, and representatives from the Armed Forces including the Army and the RAF. The students especially enjoyed trying the helicopter flight simulator! The Year 10s came back to the Academy with lots of ideas about their future careers and the skills they would need to achieve their dreams!

#### RESPECT FANTASTIC FUNDRAISING EFFORTS FROM THE **ROCKWOOD COMMUNITY!**

Staff, students and parents have all worked extremely hard this term to raise money for different charities. Our first big event was the Macmillan Coffee Morning which was held on 1st October 2018. Cakes were brought in by staff and students, and then sold to raise funds for the Macmillan Cancer Support, a charity which supports those affected by cancer. The total raised was £469.53. The cakes were amazing, particularly Miss Bibi's cupcakes! But on a serious note, we are proud to support a charity like Macmillan as so many people, including those in our school community, have been affected by someone's cancer diagnosis.

Another huge fundraising event was Children in Need. Activities took place throughout the day across the Academy. Students were invited to wear an item of yellow (at a price, of course)! Other events included another delicious bake sale, which again included some of Miss Bibi's smashing cakes, and some tasty samosas which were the hit of the sale! We also had a football match between the Year 10 and Year 11 boys, with the Year 10s coming out as victors. A great evening was had by all who attended, and we wish the 2018 leavers every success for the future.









#### DRAMA

All KS4 groups have been working towards their U1 performance, a devised piece they are solely responsible for directing, creating, and performing in. The following are the highlights:

#### in Y11:

One group have created a performance in an advanced style of satire, using comedy to highlight the smears and lies directed at women during the suffragette movement. One group have used a proscenium arch inspired fairytale style to tell the delightful story of womens' rights through the ages.

#### In Y10:

One group have created a naturalistic performance looking at the struggle of Ms Pankhurst, and the practice of force feeding in prisons in the early 1900s.

#### In Y9:

One group have used a large cast to create a piece of physical theatre with an emphasis on sound to show aggressive attitudes towards peaceful protest. One group have focused on using contrasting techniques to highlight difference between two different time periods. We are looking forward to seeing the finished results!






## ENGLISH

The Old Rep Theatre - On Wednesday 19th September, Year 11s had a thrilling experience at The old Rep to watch Jekyll& Hyde, described by Stevenson himself as a "fine bogey tale" of the 19th century.

It is a narrative of a respectable doctor who transforms himself into a savage murderer. The novella is based on the duality of good v evil.

Students extremely enjoyed the lighthearted production dramatised and felt that it helped enrich their understanding of the play in preparation for their GCSE exam.



Welcome to Wales! A group of Year 10 and 11 students visited Rhyd-y-Creuau field centre for 3 days. This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to experience outdoor learning and team building.

The students worked extremely hard to collect data for their field work in the villages of Penmachno and Betws-y-Coed to analyse the differences between the two. We also visited a small mountain stream near Mount Snowdon to measure the width and depth of the water.

During the evening students enjoyed orienteering and using maps to find clues and complete a treasure hunt as well as listen to ghost stories told by Mr Khan.

### HISTORY

Year 8 students have been exploring the city of Birmingham during the industrial revolution. Students have been fascinated to learn how Birmingham was a leading industrial city and significantly contributed to Britain's success in the war. Year 7 students have been focusing on key history skills and sharpening their understanding to become historians of the future.

Finally, students have been participating in the Echo Eternal project where Rockwood Academy will be working with key organisations to explore and promote the significance of the Holocaust.

This project engages children and young people in commemorating the Holocaust, inspired by the testimony of survivors. The Echo Eternal pilot commenced in Birmingham on Holocaust Memorial Day 2018 and will run for twelve months in twelve schools.

The project will then pass to a new host city within the UK where it will continue to grow and evolve. Each city will work with partner organisations to create its own distinct "echo" which will ultimately be made available nationally via the new Holocaust Memorial and education centre.



#### **PARENTS' CLASSES**
