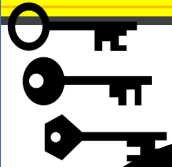


Learning Journey Map

Year 7 Survival Top Tips

2. Telling the time; using the verb ir (to go) and saying activities you do in town.
3. Ordering food in a café; using the verb querer (to want).
4. Talking about plans in the weekend; using the near future tense.
5. Understanding people describing their town.

1. Describing your family; using possessive adjectives.
2. Describing your hair and eye colour; using irregular verbs tener and ser.
3. Saying what other people look like; using agreement of adjectives with nouns.

All about my school

1. Saying what subject you study; using -ar verbs to say what 'we' do.
2. Giving opinions about school subjects; using me gusta(n) + el/la/los/las.
3. Describing your school; using the words for 'a', 'some' and 'the' (plural definite and indefinite articles).
4. Talking about break time; using the present tense of regular -er and -ir verbs
5. Listening & writing details about schools.

All about my hobbies / free time

1. Saying what you like to do; giving opinions using me gusta + infinitive.
2. Saying what you do in your spare time; using the present tense (ar verbs)
3. Talking about weather & activities; using cuando/when.
4. Saying what sports you do; using irregular verbs such as hacer.
5. Reading challenging text about someone's favourite things.

Introduction to Spanish

1. Introduction to Spanish/ phonics & pronunciation.
2. Introducing yourself; using definite articles (el, la, los, las) and introducing verb endings.
3. Talking about your personality; using adjectives that end in -o/-a
4. Talking about age, brothers and sisters; using tener (present, singular)
5. Saying when your birthday is.
6. Talking about your pets; using adjective forms.
7. Writing a text for a time capsule adding variety to your writing.
